Skills through practical training

Certificate qualifications provide a solid foundation for entry-level agricultural careers, and pathways towards further study and career specialisation.

Vocational Education and Training in Schools (VETiS)

Combine a high school education with nationally recognised vocational qualifications.

Available to high school students in Year 10, 11 or 12¹, training is conducted at a school's trade or agricultural training facilities, or utilising other local locations such as showgrounds or industry sites depending on course requirements. Students interested in completing vocational training should speak to their school VET coordinator, guidance officer or contact Queensland Agricultural Training Colleges on 1800 888 710 for more information.

¹ Students must be a minimum 15 years of age, and some units may be restricted to 16 years and older, e.g. quad bikes.

School-Based, Work-Based Training and Apprenticeships

Cement your knowledge with paid, on-the-job practical training.

Available to new or existing employees² on a full time or part time basis, students complete a combination of online theory at work, plus on- or off-site training with instructors as required. Off-site training can include industry site visits or the use of specialised facilities. Training is funded by the Queensland Government under the Certificate III Guarantee (Vocational Education and Training in Schools) program and/or the User Choice program, subject to student eligibility.

<p>AHC20116 – Certificate II in Agriculture As an entry-level qualification, students gain a broad understanding of agriculture, one of the most important and diverse industries in Australia.</p>	2 years part time
<p>AHC21216 – Certificate II in Rural Operations With a diverse range of units on offer, schools can help students to study areas of interest such as agriculture, land management, machinery, fabrication, livestock, and more. Suitable streams are developed and customised based on the outcomes the school requires.</p>	2 years part time
<p>AHC21016 – Certificate II in Conservation and Land Management This qualification enables graduates to carry out conservation and resource management tasks under general guidance and supervision.</p>	2 years part time

<p>AHC20416 – Certificate II in Horticulture This qualification underpins a range of entry-level work functions within the horticultural industry, and is an excellent stepping stone to trade qualifications.</p>	1 year full time / 2 years part time
<p>AHC20316 – Certificate II in Production Horticulture An introductory qualification allowing students to explore a range of production horticulture options.</p>	1 year full time / 2 years part time
<p>AHC21016 – Certificate II in Conservation and Land Management This qualification enables graduates to carry out conservation and resource management tasks under general guidance and supervision.</p>	1 year full time / 2 years part time
<p>AHC30116 – Certificate III in Agriculture Students have the chance to focus on a preferred agricultural sector, including: Cropping, Livestock, Mixed (Cropping & Livestock), Horticulture and Production Horticulture.</p>	2 years full time / 4 years part time
<p>AHC30616 – Certificate III in Production Horticulture Students and employers are able to focus the traineeship on a specific enterprise or take a general approach with units covering mixed horticultural enterprises.</p>	2 years full time / 4 years part time
<p>AHC31416 – Certificate III in Conservation and Land Management Students develop natural resource management skills which can be applied across a wide assortment of sectors, including environmental conservation, parks and wildlife, indigenous land management, and even pastoral enterprises.</p>	2 years full time / 4 years part time

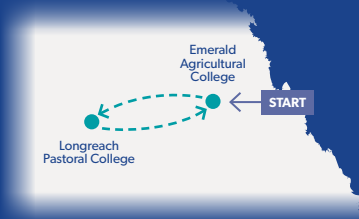
